To hold my teacher as equal to my parents, to share my substance with him, and relieve his necessities if required; to regard his offspring as equal to my brothers and to teach them this Art - if they desire to learn it - without fee or stipulation. I will impart my knowledge of the Art to my own sons, and those of my teachers, and to disciples bound by an oath according the law of medicine, but to none others.

I will follow the method of treatment which, according to my ability and judgment, I consider for the benefit of my patients, and abstain from whatever is deleterious. I will give no deadly medicine to any one if asked and in like manner I will not give a woman a pessary to produce abortion.

In purity and holiness I will guard my life and my Art. I will not use the knife, not even on sufferers from stone, but will leave this to be done by men who are practitioners of this work.

Whatever house I may visit, I will enter for the benefit of the sick, remaining free of all intentional injustice, of all mischief and in particular of sexual relations with either females or males, be they freemen or slaves. Whatever I may see or hear in the course of the treatment, or even outside of the treatment in regard to the life of men, I will not divulge, as reckoning that all such should be kept secret.

If I fulfill this oath and do not violate it, may it be granted to me to enjoy life and art, being honoured with fame among all men for all time to come. But should I trespass and violate this Oath, may the reverse be my lot.
